As a mentor, you will be connected for a 45-minute interactive session with a class interested in discovering more about your field. Teachers will provide you with questions from their class prior to the event. For a limited time, keen students will have the opportunity to follow-up with you via online chat for continued discussion.

What is the program about? Who's involved?

Coastal Explorers Mentor Program brings the ocean into the classroom by connecting high school classes and students across the province with mentors from participating ocean science and technology companies. The program exposes youth from rural Newfoundland to inspiring ocean professionals and breaks down the professional/student barrier by linking real-world work with in-class curriculum. The program is being piloted this fall with mentors and companies that took part in our Ocean Science and Technology Summer Internship Pilot Program.

How does it work?

This fall we'll digitally bring ocean science and technology mentors into the classroom. Coastal Explorers Mentor Program will connect you with a class interested in your field in an interactive online session. Teachers will provide you with questions from their class prior to your session and you will have the opportunity to build your relationship with the class through a chat based online mentorship platform for 30 days after the session. Coastal Explorers Field School will assess school requests, match to mentor profiles, and provide you with the tools and resources to ensure success.

What do you expect of a mentor? What is my role as a mentor?

Your role as a mentor is share your experience and passion for what you do with interested high school students. What excites you the most about walking into work? How did you get there? How does what you do impact your organization, your community, your province? This is an amazing opportunity to break down the wall between school and work, put a friendly face on your profession, and help provide students with an appreciation for your field.

What is the time commitment?

Participate in an interactive 45-minute video session and Q&A to a high school class with an interest in your field. Address questions pre-identified by the class during your presentation. Be available to respond to follow-up questions from the class on your own schedule for 30 days on our online mentoring platform. We anticipate 30 minutes or less a week for each mentor to respond to class questions via our interactive mentor platform.



Why do I have to go through a background check?

NLESD policy requires all volunteers working with students in moderate to high-risk environments to acquire a Certificate of Conduct from RCMP or RNC.
